How Has My Research Placement Developed My Understanding of Scaffolding, Co-navigation and Learner Autonomy in Higher-Education Supervision?

- **Quantitative Educational Research:** Investigated the relationship between food insecurity and education among students, using SPSS to analyse quantitative data and identify patterns with implications for educational and social inequality.
- **Methodological Decision-Making:** Explored Python as an alternative tool for data analysis and developed an initial proposal for a food-insecurity prediction programme; critically evaluated its feasibility and selected methods according to their suitability rather than technical complexity.
- **Theory-Informed Reflection:** Applied scaffolding theory, Vygotsky's Zone of Proximal Development and concepts of reflective practice to examine how dialogue, trust and the gradual transfer of responsibility can foster learner autonomy within higher-education research supervision.
